# [The Nippon Foundation News] A New Phase of Ocean Exploration

Greetings from The Nippon Foundation. William Adams (1564 – 1620) was a navigator whose ship became stranded off the coast of Kyushu in 1600 and is regarded as the first Englishman to reach Japan. With a few exceptions, Japan was closed to foreigners at this time, but he went on to become an important advisor to the shogun Tokugawa Ieyasu, advising on trade and diplomatic matters. He oversaw the building of Japan's first Western-style ships, led trade missions to Southeast Asia, and helped to establish Dutch and English trading posts in Japan. He was one of the first Westerners to achieve the rank of samurai and is the basis for the main character in James Clavell's novel "Shogun." Today a stone marker indicates where his house in what is now the Nihonbashi area of Tokyo once stood.

The Nippon Foundation was originally founded as the Japan Shipbuilding Industry Foundation, and throughout our history safe navigation and other ocean issues have been at the core of our activities. In May, a team affiliated with The Nippon Foundation won the Shell Ocean Discovery XPRIZE, an international competition in deep-sea exploration technology. The team's work is related to The Nippon Foundation – GEBCO Seabed 2030 Project, which seeks to expand our understanding of the ocean and aid navigation by mapping 100% of the ocean's floor by 2030. The team's success in the XPRIZE competition marks a major step toward the achievement of that goal.
