Greetings from The Nippon Foundation. Tokyo saw its "first snowfall" of the season on November 9-10 at Yoyogi Park. "Tokyo Snow Festival x HEROS FESTA 2019" was held jointly by The Nippon Foundation's HEROS project and the NGO Snowbank, with five blocks of ice weighing 155 kilograms each brought to Yoyogi Park from Fukushima Prefecture to make snow to build a short snowboard course and for other activities. Coast guards from around the world gather



The 2nd Coast Guard Global Summit, bringing together top officials involved in ocean safety from around the world, was held in Tokyo on November 20-21. Roughly 200 people representing 84 institutions from 75 countries attended the event, which was jointly organized by The Nippon Foundation and the Japan Coast Guard, to discuss the future direction of ocean policies. The summit reaffirmed the importance of involving coast guards at the global level to resolve issues that cannot be solved by any single country or region on its own, and formulated a set of operating guidelines and established a committee to consider a sustainable and functional framework for its work going forward.
