#### [The Nippon Foundation News] Repurposing Facilities in Response to New Coronavirus

Although Japan to date has had fewer infections from the new coronavirus than have been seen in some other countries, the number of infections is increasing and measures are being implemented to slow the spread of the pandemic. Even before the prime minister declared a state of emergency for seven prefectures including Tokyo, Tokyo's governor had requested that residents stay indoors and postpone non-urgent, non-essential weekend outings and refrain from going out after work on weeknights. The Nippon Foundation began implementing internal measures from February 20, and from March 17 these measures were expanded to include telework for all employees.

At a press conference held on April 3, the Foundation announced that The Nippon Foundation Para Arena, located next to the Museum of Maritime Science in Odaiba, Tokyo, would be repurposed and heavy-duty tents set up in the adjacent parking lot and park area to accommodate roughly 1,000 hospital beds for COVID-19 patients should they become necessary. There will also be rest and dining areas for medical staff, and some of the tents will be set up to allow patient's family members to stay with them. These plans were made in consultation with medical experts who said that hospital capacity is likely to be one of the greatest challenges in the event of a surge in infections. The structures are scheduled to be ready by the end of April, with the specific configuration and equipment to be installed to be coordinated by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government and the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare. ### Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds

23rd installment surveys awareness of inequality



The 23rd installment of the Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds was carried out in late February on the theme of "Inequality." The survey found that more than half of respondents felt a sense of economic inequality in their daily lives, while less than one-fourth believed this inequality could be rectified. In response to the fact that the world's billionaires possess more wealth than 60% of the global population, roughly one-third considered this unavoidable while slightly more than one-fourth considered this to be a problem.
