[The Nippon Foundation News] Tori-no-Ichi

Greetings from the Nippon Foundation. One of the highlights of November in Tokyo is the *Tori-no-Ichi* festival held at various shrines on the Days of the Rooster (which occur every 12 days) in the month of November under the Chinese zodiac calendar. Originally a harvest festival dating back to the mid-18th century, the festival has evolved into an event where merchants wish for good fortune in the coming year. A distinctive feature of the festivals is the sale of decorated bamboo rakes called *kumade* (bear's paw) to "rake in" good fortune. During the festival, the shrine grounds are usually lively and boisterous with crowds of people and stalls selling food and drink in addition to those selling kumade. This year, however, the events on November 2 were scaled back to prevent the spread of new coronavirus infections; while kumade were still being sold there were no food and drink stalls, and fewer people attending than in previous years.



Plastic Bottle Collection Machines Being Installed at 7-Eleven Stores in Yokohama

Plan for 120 locations to promote recycling and reduce ocean debris




The Nippon Foundation and Seven-Eleven Japan Co. Ltd., together with the cities of Yokohama and Fujisawa, have launched a project to recycle plastic bottles with the aim of making effective use of limited resources, promoting recycling, and reducing ocean debris. The project began with 7-Eleven convenience stores in 15 locations in Fujisawa in late August, and is being expanded to stores in Yokohama from October 30, with installations at 120 stores planned.

Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds

Reading and writing



The 30th installment of the Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds was carried out on the subject of "Reading and Writing." The survey showed that roughly 60% of respondents enjoy reading books, while slightly more than 10% do not. Asked how many books they read per month, the largest group, at 45%, read one or two books per month, which was more than the 33% who don't read any books at all. With regard to writing, roughly 30% of respondents enjoy writing, while 28% dislike writing.

The Nippon Foundation, the Nagasaki Marine Industry Cluster Promotion Association, Nagasaki Prefecture, Nagasaki University, and the Nagasaki Institute of Applied Science have established the Nagasaki Ocean Academy as Asia's first human resource training institute focusing on offshore wind power generation and other areas of ocean energy development.
