[The Nippon Foundation News] Remembering March 11

Today is the 10th anniversary of the Great East Japan Earthquake that struck the Tohoku region of northeastern Japan on March 11, 2011, causing a massive tsunami that in turn triggered a nuclear accident at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station. As a result, roughly 20,000 people lost their lives, with more than 2,500 still officially reported as missing, and more than 470,000 people were evacuated from their homes. In response, The Nippon Foundation launched the ROAD Project for the region's recovery and reconstruction, encompassing emergency support, community support, staffing support, industrial support, and organizational support.

To mark this anniversary, the Reconstruction Agency has set up a "Web portal commemorating ten years since the Great East Japan Earthquake." The purpose of the site is twofold: (1) To thank people and organizations around the world for the support they provided in the aftermath of the disaster, and to promote further recovery by showing people in Japan and around the world the status of the region's reconstruction, and highlighting the region's appeal and prospects for the future; and (2) To share the lessons learned and knowledge gained through the recovery process so they can be used to prepare for future large-scale disasters. Back to Blue project to address ocean pollution





Back to Blue is a new initiative from the Economist Group and The Nippon Foundation that was launched on March 3 at the Economist Group's eighth annual World Ocean Summit. With an initial focus on ocean pollution, the three-year collaboration seeks to address the escalating challenges posed by pollution from plastic debris and, less visibly, pollution from nutrients and chemical contaminants that are damaging ocean life and ecosystems, and in turn human health.

Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds

Decarbonization



The 34th installment of the Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds was carried out in mid-January on the subject of "Decarbonization." Two-thirds of respondents cited greenhouse gas emissions associated with human social activity as the main cause of global warming, and more than three-fourths were aware of the risks this posed. In addition, while 60% of respondents approved of the government's pledge to eliminate greenhouse gas emissions and make Japan carbon neutral by 2050, only 14% believed it was achievable.

'Mr. Toilet' takes unique approach to raise awareness of serious issues



Jack Sim, a social entrepreneur from Singapore who is working to create a "toilet culture" around the world, founded the World Toilet Organization (WTO) in 2001. Each year, the WTO presents a WTO Hall of Fame Award to individuals or organizations that have made a contribution to public hygiene, and in 2020 the prize was awarded to The Nippon Foundation's THE TOKYO TOILET project as a communication project to generate discussion of toilets and to let the rest of the world know about Japan's toilet culture.

How Jigoro Kano's thinking changed the world



Japan's Olympic movement began in 1909, when Jigoro Kano, principal of Tokyo Higher Normal School (the present University of Tsukuba), became the first person from Asia to serve on the International Olympic Committee (IOC). Having studied two styles of the Japanese martial art jujutsu as a student, he later combined and improved on the best features of both forms to create judo as a new subject that could have educational value. Since then, judo has become popular around the world, becoming an Olympic sport in 1964.
