Greetings from The Nippon Foundation. The weather in Tokyo is currently transitioning from spring to summer, with the temperature earlier this week surpassing 30° C for the first time this year. This week would mark the beginning of the rainy season in an average year, but it appears that this year's start is still at least a few days away. In coronavirus-related news, the state of emergency declared in late April for Tokyo, Osaka, and several other prefectures has been extended to June 20. An encouraging development, however, is that the pace of vaccinations is picking up. In addition to the original program being carried out by local municipal governments, large-scale vaccination centers have begun operating in Tokyo and Osaka, and large companies and universities are preparing to begin offering on-site vaccinations to employees and their families and to students later this month.

Preamble to the Constitution

With constitutional revision an issue that continues to be discussed in Japan, the 37th installment of the Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds was carried out in mid-April on the subject of the "Preamble to the Constitution." The survey found that 40% of respondents have either read or have a recollection of having read the Preamble, and of those, more than half said that they read it when they were in junior high school. More than 80% of all respondents replied that it was difficult to understand or that there were points that they could not understand.
