A Happy New Year from The Nippon Foundation! The New Year holidays in Japan are traditionally a time for travel and gatherings of friends and colleagues. In December 2020, these activities were mostly canceled because of COVID-19, but December 2021 saw a return of some activity, although still more subdued than in the past. More families returned to their hometowns than in the previous year, and television news showed scenes of grandparents happy to be seeing their grandchildren for the first time in two years. Friends once again gathered in small groups, but companies mostly refrained from holding large parties for employees and customers. On New Year's Eve, popular temples and shrines that were quiet last year once again saw crowds of (masked) people lining up to offer prayers for the new year. The first grand sumo tournament of the year began as scheduled on January 9, but with restrictions on the number of tickets sold and other measures being taken to prevent the spread of infections. Restaurants and the travel industry are also seeing customers begin to return, while remaining vigilant against new waves of infections.

International and Multicultural Coexistence



The 43rd installment of the Awareness Survey of 18-Year-Olds was carried out on the subject of "International and Multicultural Coexistence." The survey, intended to examine young people's interest in countries other than Japan and their perception of non-Japanese persons living in Japan, found that the pandemic has had a negative effect on young people's desire to be internationally engaged, and also suggested a correlation between having experienced or being interested in international exchange and receptiveness toward diversity.

'Spaceship Earth' design theme



The Nippon Foundation and Osaka University today announced that the building to house The Nippon Foundation - Osaka University Infectious Disease Project will have an elliptical shape to evoke an image of "Spaceship Earth," with the design overseen by Pritzker Prize-winning architect Tadao Ando to incorporate a sense of bringing together top researchers from around the world in a collaborative endeavor. Scheduled for completion in February 2025, the building will become a new landmark for Osaka University and all of Japan.

The Nippon Foundation has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the international offshore technology development consortium DeepStar for the establishment of a joint research and development program to promote decarbonization in the field of offshore oil and natural gas, with a focus on renewable energy and the environment. The program is being launched with a budget of up to \$10 million (roughly 1.1 billion yen), and is scheduled to run through 2026.
