[The Nippon Foundation News] Marine Day Greetings

Greetings from The Nippon Foundation. With the rainy season ending and schools starting summer vacation later in the month, July marks the beginning of summer in Japan in a practical sense. The third Monday in July is Marine Day, a public holiday to give thanks for ocean's bounty. The Nippon Foundation and the Japanese government jointly launched the *Umi-to-Nippon* Project (The Ocean and Japan Project) in 2016, and in November 2018 we started the Change for the Blue project to expand and develop new projects involving the private sector, the public sector, and academia. Both projects will be holding ocean-related events around Japan this summer, including beach cleanups, workshops and seminars, and recreational events.

Another symbol of summer in Japan is the *hozuki* (Physalis alkekengi; Chinese lantern plant), an ornamental plant with flowers that resemble paper lanterns. Temporary markets selling the plants are a summer tradition, and the most famous in Tokyo takes place at Sensoji temple in Asakusa. Sensoji is one of Tokyo's oldest and most famous Buddhist temples, and the Hozuki-Ichi (Hozuki Market) there takes place every year on July 9 and 10. Many stalls are set up with vendors selling potted hozuki plants as well as flowers and clipped branches. There is also a belief that prayers offered at Sensoji on July 10 will bring 46,000 days of blessings, making this a popular time to visit the temple.

The first two 15-member groups of Japanese university student volunteers participating in The Volunteer Program for Ukraine have returned to Japan after spending two weeks each in Poland assisting evacuees from Ukraine. Targeting 1 billion yen to welcome evacuees from Ukraine on behalf of Japanese people



The Nippon Foundation, together with U.S. Ambassador to Japan Rahm Emanuel and Ukrainian Ambassador to Japan Sergiy Korsunsky, announced the establishment of the Ukrainian Evacuees Assistance Fund, which has begun accepting donations to assist people who have evacuated to Japan from Ukraine. The Fund was established as a way for Japanese people to express their feeling of welcome to evacuees from Ukraine, so that "each evacuee can live comfortably in Japan, even though they are far from home."
