

## [The Nippon Foundation News] Responding to a Flood Disaster

Greetings from The Nippon Foundation. In what has become an almost annual occurrence, the rainy season has again brought heavy rain to southwest Japan. Shinkansen (bullet train) services were disrupted over the weekend and warnings have been issued for additional downpours, with residents of threatened areas being told to be vigilant against flooding and landslides. The Nippon Foundation has provided support for recovery from these events in the past, and we intend to provide support to local volunteer organizations this year as well.

Shintsuna, a Nagoya-based NGO that is active in the area of disaster recovery, has prepared a flyer in English titled "Recovering from a Flood Disaster," providing information on steps to take in the event your home is flooded. While some of the information is specific to Japan, much of it is useful regardless of where you are, including advice for cleaning your house and possessions and what to wear to protect yourself while cleaning.

A ceremony was held on June 23 at the Shibuya City Hall to hand over the public toilets renovated by The Nippon Foundation's THE TOKYO TOILET project to the Shibuya City government. The project was carried out with the participation of 16 creators who endorsed the project's goal and used the power of design and creativity to offer proposals for a new society.
